Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary


The feast of the Visitation the visit of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth shortly after the Annunciation; the cleansing of John the Baptist from original sin in the womb of his mother at the words of Our Lady's greeting; Elizabeth's proclaiming of Mary as Mother of God and "blessed among women"; Mary's singing of the sublime hymn, *Magnificat* ("My soul magnifies the Lord"). The Visitation is frequently depicted in art, and was the central mystery of Saint Francis de Sales' devotions.

The Mass salutes her who in her womb bore the King of heaven and earth, the Creator of the world, the Son of the Eternal Father, the Sun of Justice. It narrates the cleansing of John from original sin in his mother's womb. Hearing herself addressed by the most lofty title of "Mother of the Lord" and realizing what grace her visit had conferred on John, Mary broke out in that sublime canticle of praise proclaiming prophetically that henceforth she would be venerated down through the centuries:

"My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior. Because he that is mighty has done great things to me, and holy is His name." (Luke 1:46)
