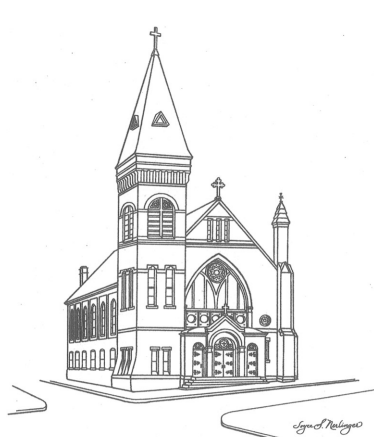

## Saint Aloysius Gonzaga

The time and place where he grew up — 16th-century Italy — is not very different from 21st century America. It was a lax, morally careless, self-indulgent age. Aloysius saw the decadence around him and vowed not to be part of it. Aloysius did not just want to be good, he wanted to be holy. When he was 16 he joined the Society of Jesus. Later, the plague struck Rome. The Jesuits sent every priest and novice to work in the wards. He went into the streets of Rome and carried the ill and the dying to the hospital on his back. Within a few weeks, Aloysius contracted the plague himself and died. He was 23 years old.
