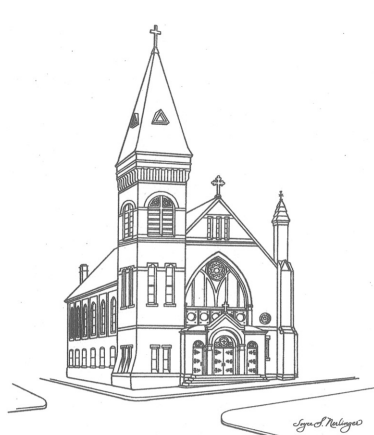

# Saint Anthony of Padua

Born at Lisbon, Portugal, he became a canon regular and then a Franciscan preaching the Gospel everywhere in Portugal and Italy. Because of his success in converting heretics, he was called the "Hammer of Heretics" and because of his learning, Saint Francis himself appointed him a teacher of theology. He became associated with Padua because he made this city his residence and the center of his great preaching mission.

His preaching was inspired by the love of God and of souls and had an extraordinary power of conviction; it was filled with the penetrating power of the Bible. Pope Gregory IX, who heard him preach, called him during his lifetime the *Arca Testamenti*, meaning "the living repository of the Holy Scriptures" and Pope Pius XII, when he proclaimed him a Doctor of the Church, declared that he based all that he said on the texts of the Gospels, and could justly be called the Evangelical Doctor.

St. Anthony died at Padua in 1231 at age 36, with the reputation of great sanctity.
